STPF ESSENTIALS: COMMUNICATION POLICIES

General Comm Policies

- STPF communications channels should not be used for partisan commentary or political fundraising.
 - If you plan to or are running for office, let us / your program manager know!
 - This includes listservs.
- Be mindful! Treat these as public forums and use professionalism.
 - WhatsApp groups
 - Slack channel
 - Fellows listserv

General Comm Policies

- In communications with STPF, AAAS, agencies, etc., fellows are expected to:
 - Adhere to ethics policies.
 - Maintain a dispassionate tone.
 - Demonstrate decorum.
 - Be mindful of both real and perceived conflicts of interest.
- Have questions about your fellowship or the STPF program?
 - Your program managers are your BEST SOURCE!!
 - Please reach out to them or fellowships@aaas.org and we will get your questions answered.

General Comm Policies

- With STPF professional development (e.g., orientation) events:
 - Do not share private or sensitive information.
 - **Do not share comments/slides made by speakers without speaker permission.**
- Did you draft or help write a bill/a major piece of work?
 - **STPF practice is to attribute authorship to the legislator(s).**
 - It is better to say:
 - “I helped write this bill”
 - “I was instrumental in crafting this bill.”

Communicating with the Media

- STPF encourages fellows to communicate science and technology to the public!

- Before giving an interview or comments for a media story:
 - **Check with your host office media relations staff for any clearance or guidance.**
- **When speaking to the media, seek out permission from us before mentioning STPF or AAAS. AAAS is rigorously nonpartisan.**
 - In any interview or public speaking, make it clear that you speak as an individual, and not on behalf of AAAS or its journals.
 - Email fellowships@aaas.org with any questions.

Naming Affinity Groups & Your Events

- **Group Name** – name of any group/platform/channel/entity formally associated with the fellowship must include “STPF” in it.
 - **Example:** STPF Biofuels Affinity Group
- Notify STPF of any new webpages pages, groups, platform profiles created during your fellowship.
- If you want to include “AAAS,” you must also include “STPF” or “Policy Fellows”.
 - Avoid confusion with AAAS Fellows, AAAS Mass Media Fellows, etc.
- Tag the STPF account (@AAAS_STPF) so we can see and share your posts!
- **Logo usage:** Usage of STPF logo is not allowed without permission from STPF.

Referring to Your Fellowship

- All STPF fellows may add “2025-26” to the beginning of that title to denote your class: I’m a **2025-26 AAAS S&T Policy Fellow!**
- **Double check the format with your partner society (if applicable).**
